We have received subsequent reports in Upper Beeding regarding this and now believe we know the identity of the riders. We have increased our patrols in the area in the times they are most likely to be around (as per reports from residents) On one occasion we came across an unlicensed motorbike which drove off at speed after seeing us, unfortunately we were unable to get a positive I.D. We are hoping that by continuing with direct patrols relating to this we will be able to get a positive identification and work towards obtaining a section 59 warning with the police. Section 59 warnings can result in a vehicle being seized and crushed.This month has been quiet in relation to other kinds of Anti-Social Behaviour.We continue with patrols of the river footpath as reported upon last month.
